STUDY ON AVIFAUNAL DIVERSITY OF GANGULPARA REGION OF DISTRICT BALAGHAT, MADHYA PRADESH

ABSTRACT: A healthy ecosystem depends on the diversity of its avian inhabitants, which also serves as a reliable indication of environmental changes. The current study aimed to describe the richness, habitat strata, migratory patterns, and conservation status of the avifauna in the Gangulpara waterfall and forest areas of the Balaghat region. Between December 2020 and July 2021, 121 bird species from 20 orders and 54 families were identified as part of this study. The 121 bird species were identified into 114 residents (R), 4 winter migrants (WM), and 3 summer migrants (SM) species. On the IUCN Red List 3.1, out of 121 species, 116 bird species were listed as Least Concern (LC), 4 as Near Threatened (NT), and 1 as Vulnerable (VU).
