ENDANGERED MEDICINAL PLANTS OF DIFFERENT RANGES OF KINWAT FOREST OF MAHARASHTRA

ABSTRACT: The Marathwada region is known to harbour 1,645 flowering species, of which about 350 have medicinal value in the folklore system. During the survey of Kinwat forest, Soymidia febrifusa (Rogtarohini) of family Meliaceae, Hymenodictyon obovatum (Borsag) of family Rubiaceae and Radermachera xylocarpa (Tagar Vagar.) of family Bignoniaceae were observed to be rare in their habitat. Therefore, it is essential to protect and save as valuable medicinal plants.
